## SHOULD YOU CONSIDER FOSTERING?

Ask yourself the following questions to help decide. Will you be able to:

- Love and care for a child with a challenging background and sometimes difficult behavior?
- Help the child develop a sense of belonging in your home, even though his or her stay may be temporary?
- Stand by the child through life's ups and downs?
- Be willing to work with the child's birth family?
- Feel that it's your personal mission to help children in crisis?





### **REQUIREMENTS**

Foster parent candidates must:

- Be a Florida resident age 21 and older;
- Be financially stable;
- Be able to care for children;
- Pass an extensive background check and home study;
- Have reliable and safe transportation; and
- Have adequate room and beds in your home for children.

The biggest requirement to be a foster parent is love — and the desire to help children move past their past.







### **MYTHS ABOUT FOSTERING**

Many myths surround foster parenting. Please keep these facts in mind:

 MYTH: You have to be wealthy and a homeowner to foster.

**FACT:** You may rent or own your home, and you definitely don't have to be rich. It's the size of your heart – not your paycheck – that matters.

MYTH: You have to be married to foster.

**FACT:** Single, partnered, and married people can all be great foster parents.

 MYTH: Foster parents must have biological children or prior parenting experience.

FACT: You don't have to have children of your own or past parenting experience, just lots of love in your heart.

• MYTH: Only younger adults can foster.

**FACT:** The only age requirement is that you must be at least 21. Many great foster parents are in their 50s or 60s.

MYTH: LGBTQ people can't foster.

**FACT:** Many excellent foster parents are part of the LGBTQ community.

Don't be deceived by foster parenting myths. If you feel called to foster, Children's Network of Southwest Florida and our community partners are here to help—and that's a fact.



# BEGIN YOUR FOSTERING JOURNEY

The path to becoming licensed foster parent in Southwest Florida involves the following steps:

- Contact Children's Network of Southwest Florida: We are the local lead agency selected by the State of Florida to oversee the child welfare system in our community.
- 2. Attend the Pre-Service Training Class: Complete the 30-hour parenting program called PRIDE.
- 3. Complete the Other Licensing Requirements:
  These include background checks, an inspection of the home, and an assessment of the family called a "home study."
- 4. Welcome Your First Foster Child: You will make a difference for a lifetime in a relatively short time.

Take the first step today. Contact Children's Network of Southwest Florida to become a foster parent, and change a life for good.
